Job Specs

Weight: 4500 Tons

Dimensions:

160'W x 286'L x 175'H

Equipment Used: 160 lines of SPMTs, loading ramps, winch trucks for barge securement, water pumps and steel plating for load spreading

This 4500 ton behemoth known as the Redhawk is the very first spar platform ever to be decommissioned and the Berard Team had the honor of offloading it. The team went to work assembling the 160 axle lines of self propelled modular transporters to move the 160' wide by 286' long platform from the deck barge to the client's fabrication yard which had several other existing platforms in it. Once the cargo began to roll off of the deck barge, the team executed a left hand turn to clear the obstacles in the yard making for a very tight fit. The project was completed safely and timely with a happy client and a successful offload for the world's first spar platform decommissioning. Thanks to everyone for putting their efforts and hard work into this and every project we do!

Weight: 772 & 508 Tons Dimensions:

102'W x 128'L 86'W x 102'L

Equipment Used: 32 lines of ESE SPMTs and 32 lines of ESEs for jacking, loading ramps, winch trucks for barge securement, water pumps and steel plating

Being innovative is what has brought Berard to the forefront of the heavy transport industry and this project was just another example. The team began the project by jacking down one of the two decks 12 feet using a unique method of stacking an ESE spmt onto another ESE spmt and using both to lower the deck. Now with the deck lowered, the team transported the deck to the load out area with the ESEs remaining in a stacked position. When the team reached the bulkhead, crane mats were stacked and loading ramps placed onto the mats so the upper ESEs could be driven off of the lower ESEs and onto the deck barge. This was a first for the team and it was pulled off without a hitch. The decks were then barged to Houston, Texas where they were offloaded onto a fabricator's yard for refurbishment. This was a project for the history books at Berard and it's just the challenge we look for and conquer everyday at Berard!








