Job Specs

Weight: 300,000 Lbs. Each

Equipment Used: 8 axle PST-SLE, ballast pumps, barge ramps, winch trucks, 12 axle Goldhofer THP, Prime mover, unified jacking system & 300 ton skid system

After planning for nearly 18 months, the Berard team tackled the task of delivering and installing seven generators at the city-owned power plant in Alexandria, Louisiana. The 150 ton generators were all loaded onto a deck barge at the Port of New Orleans, then barged up the Red River to the Port of Alexandria. High water levels and rapid currents were a cause for concern for a safe roll-off. Berard designed a plan with sufficient mooring and tugboats to safely get the cargo to land. Once offloaded from the barge, the team moved each generator set one by one to the final plant where they were slid and jacked down onto their operating pads. Taking one day per generator to move four miles and set on the operating pad, all generators were offloaded from the barge and set in under two weeks. Knowing this was a momentous task, the project owner had concerns about the success of the project; all concerns were relieved thanks to the precise planning and reliable work by the Berard team.



Equipment Used: 16 axle lines of SPMTs, 2 PPUs, 1 SPMT spacer, loading ramps, high volume water pumps and winch trucks for barge securement.

The team took on the task of loading out nine suction piles in the sweltering heat of South Louisiana. Transporting suction piles is nothing new to the Berard team as we've done it several times before. The 266 ton suction piles will be used in a new anchor system application that will moor a drilling ship in 9,600 feet of water.

All nine suction piles were loaded onto a 400' x 105' deck barge for transport to the final location. The team did a great job staying hydrated in this incredible heat as well as working safely alongside the client's personnel to make this yet another great and successful job!
