

Deja Vu? Once again the Berard Team took on another jacking project that was very familiar to the team. In the October issue of OnTheMove, we showcased a double platform jacking and load out project featuring these same two offshore platforms. This time, the team had to lift the decks up 12 feet so the fabricator could add additional legs bringing the decks to a new height for their client. The team began the project by jacking up the two decks using the same method of stacking an SPMT onto another SPMT and using both to lift the deck. The team also utilized steel beams and crane mats to get the height required. Once at the new height, the fabricator welded the additional legs. The team will be back at a later date to load out the decks for water transport to their new installations offshore.

8 axle PST-SLE transporter, unified jacking system, 300 ton skid system, steel plate. The Berard team tackled the routine task of setting three transformers in unfavorable conditions recently. These three 313,000 lb. transformers were shipped by rail to a power plant in Arkansas, where the Berard team offloaded them using a jack and slide method. The transformers were then moved within the plant to storage pads. Site conditions around the pads were harsh and constant rain worsened the situation. Steel plate was used along the transport route to support the weight of the transformer and SPMT. In three days, all three transformers were offloaded from railcars, transported, and set onto the pad.
