

The Berard team works with major shipyards throughout the nation to keep their rigorous build schedules on track. The team provided heavy transport solutions to one such shipyard that was commissioned to convert two former offshore supply vessels (OSVs) into ferries. The project included modifying the lengths, adapting the sterns and adding new bulkheads. Upon arrival at the shipyard in May of 2023, Berard transloaded the OSVs from a neighboring dry dock across the river to a deck barge, then back to the client bulkhead where they were offloaded and transported to the fabrication area. Now that the separation of the hull was complete, the Berard team was commissioned once again to move the stern section into place to make the vessel complete. The precise maneuverability of the SPMTs were essential to line up the two sections and begin the mating process. The team has performed several of these types of projects in shipyards across the US and this one was another example of Berard's expertise in providing shipyards with heavy transport solutions.


The Berard team was called in to transport and load two uniquely shaped industrial components from a South Louisiana fabricator onto a deck barge. Given the components' irregular geometry, Berard engineers collaborated closely with the fabricator months in advance to ensure the pieces were transport-ready. Leveraging ten axle lines of Scheuerle SPMTs, cribbing, and spanner beams, the crew expertly lifted and moved the components to a staging area. Later, the same equipment—along with ballast pumps, barge ramps, and winch trucks—was used to safely roll the cargo onto a deck barge. Once secured and lashed, the components were ready for delivery to their water-based project site.











Our Chief Operating Officer Braedon Berard has been busy with both work projects and coaching two baseball teams. The Loreauville Middle School team recently concluded their season in the Broussard Middle School League, finishing with a 12-2 record and coming up one game short in the championship game against top local middle schools.
