This job was a challenge due to the shallow water slip the barge was docked in. The barge height was 5' above the bulkhead so Berard engineers went to work designing and building a ramp system to move the 900 ton compressor onto the barge. Using 34 axle lines of Goldholfer transporters, the move was successfully completed on time and in a safe manner in only one day.



This 25' x 25' x 100' 340 ton cold box was loaded out using an eight axle line SPMT in the front, and two sets of four axle line SPMT's at the rear. Berard provided the barge and tug, as well as the support "cans" to secure the load to the deck of the barge for water shipment to an awaiting ship in Houston, TX.
